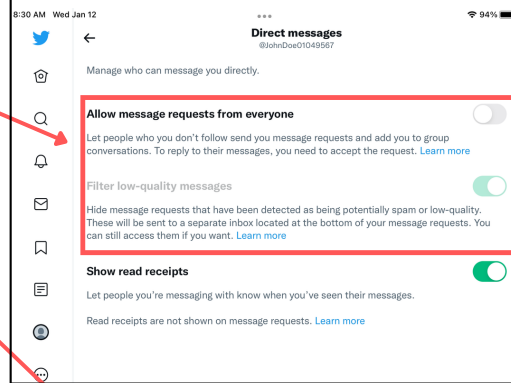
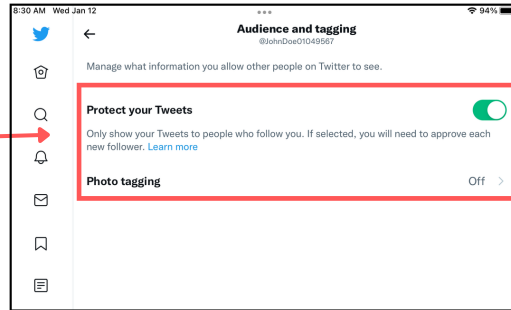
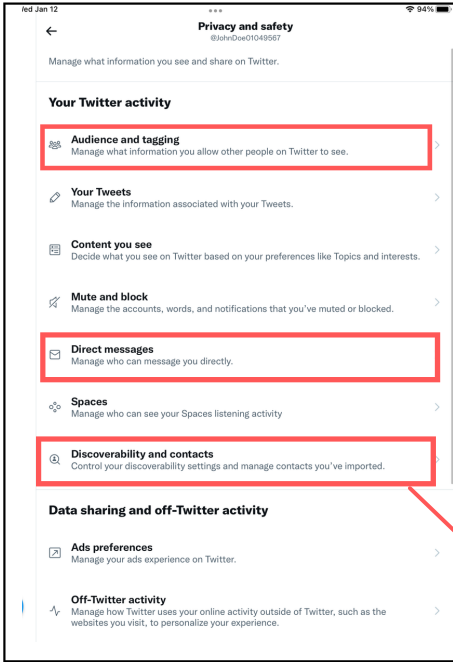
Revoke access from any apps and frequently check connected devices for unauthorized devices.

Log out of any active sessions connected from a device that you have not logged in from.

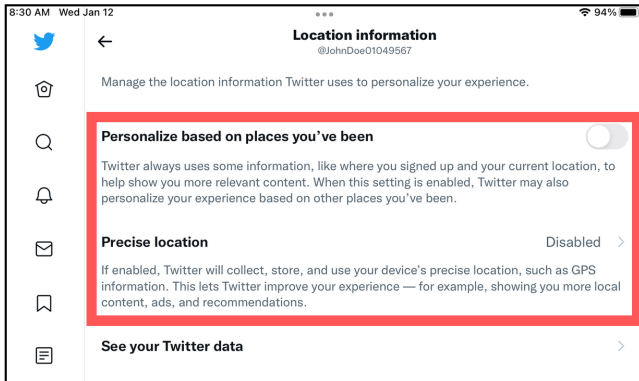

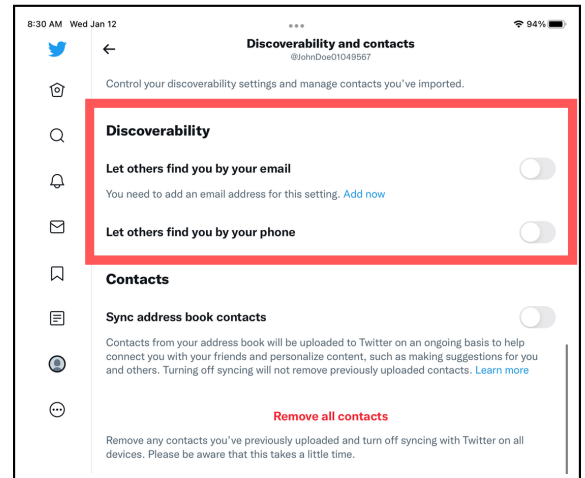

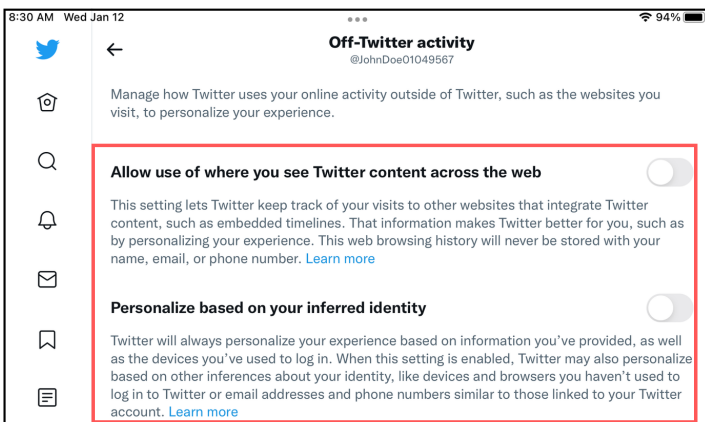
PRIVACY AND SAFETY
